## 2023 BV/S HOA Annual Meeting Membership, Constable Liaison, and Communications Reports

## Membership

Good evening my name is Don Gutierrez. I am with the HOA Board.

One of my responsibilities is to track the HOA membership. We have a total of 1170 households in Balcones Village and Spicewood Subdivisions. We had 505 HOA members for 2023. However, in 2022 we had 580. Unfortunately, we are down 75 members in 2023. Also, we had 29 properties sold in 2023. We averaged about 60 properties sold yearly per the last 3 years.

As you know we are a voluntary HOA. Our current membership annual fee is \$50. We stretch every dollar, and we try our best to keep annual fees low. We need your support and continued membership. Please talk to your neighbors about joining the HOA.

A second task that I am responsible for is to provide Welcome Folders to newcomers. I couldn't easily do this without the support of Suzie LaPlant and Gail Buckley. In these Welcome folders we include information about our 2 subdivisions, our website, our neighborhood email, and a copy of deed restrictions for that particular property. Please be aware of deed restrictions before making any home improvements and contact the HOA Architectural Committee (ACC) with any questions.

## **Constable Liaison**

The HOA coordinates with the Travis County Constable's Office Precinct 2 on traffic enforcement. Deputy Constable Ben Coe patrols our communities. He averages about 10 traffic violations monthly ranging from expired vehicle registrations, running stop signs, and speeding tickets. We have also asked him to lookout for minors driving golf carts. Our goal is to continue to keep our community streets and roads safe for all of us.
