Migrating and Over-Wintering Birds

The <u>Birdcast Migration Dashboard</u> has daily updates of the birds coming through our area. Most birds migrate at night, and Saturday over 2 million birds crossed through Travis county, flying at an average altitude of 1,900 feet and speed of 21 MPH. The website also has a list (with pictures) of the birds that are likely to be in the group. During the day, we may see flocks gathered at water sources such as those on the golf courses. Check out the website to see what is going on overhead.

In Central Texas, we have many birds who stay through the winter. <u>Bird Advisors</u> has comprehensive information about who we may see and how we can support them. The site has printable lists (with pictures) of local birds, and it is a great way to encourage interest. Scroll to the end for info about feeders and food.

In addition to fresh water, a variety of seeds and feeders may be successful. The placement of feeders should consider windows and be either adjacent to or more that 30 feet away. Otherwise, the reflection of nearby trees in windows gives the appearance of more trees, rather than a window, and birds fly into them. There is a niche market for window decals to deter bird strikes, but with double-pane windows, decals placed inside do not show through. If placed outside, they may not survive direct exposure to the elements. However, putting a few small sticky notes on the interior of windows or patio doors is very effective in stopping bird strikes.
