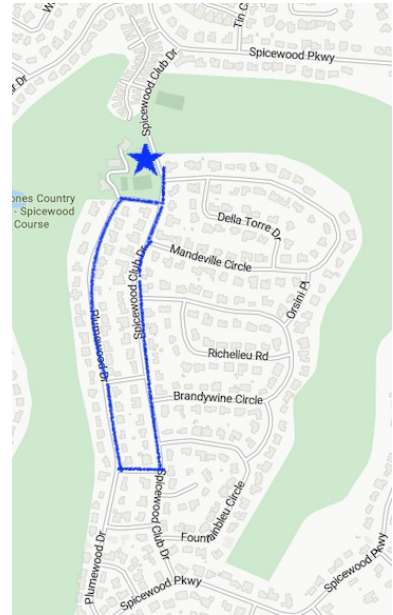




4th OF JULY PARADE

How You Can Help

Parade Route

The parade begins at the BCC clubhouse on Spicewood Club Drive.

Our local AFD fire engine and Travis County Constable lead us on Spicewood Club Drive, right on Malinda, right on Plumewood, and back to the clubhouse.

It is about a mile and easy to walk, ride bikes, and drive golf carts.

If your dog decides to come to the parade, remember the asphalt gets very hot for their feet. Bring some extra water for them, too.

US 183 North Mobility Project - Important Updates

Upcoming Work

Construction begins 24/7 operations from early June to Mid-August to remove and replace a segment of the US 183 southbound frontage road between Duval Rd. and Balcones Woods Dr.

Impact on Traffic

Drivers will experience continuous and shifting lane closures along this stretch of road. Traffic will shift from the inside to outside lanes as work progresses, and merging into one lane will be necessary at times. Signage will be prominently displayed 24/7 to guide drivers. Plan ahead if accessing businesses along the frontage roads.

The Fawns Are Here!

Fawns follow their moms and sometimes are several feet behind. This becomes important for drivers because you might not see them - especially in the dawn and dusk lights.

Drive with your vision extended to the sides of streets. On curvy streets, such as Spicewood Parkway - SLOW DOWN.

I imagine most of the drivers here have stopped in the street to let a little caravan cross, so be sure to share with our newer drivers, and people new to the neighborhood.
